 - One of the events this year was crafting with the residents. Bingo nights have also started this year where they were met with happiness and surprising competitiveness. At Christmas time with KCOS, assisted residents with their holiday shopping as well as joining them for Caroling
 - This past year, the Saskatoon Kinettes have dedicated over 120 hours to this service project alone.
 - The Saskatoon and District Kinettes look forward to continuing these relationships they've formed with the residents.
